

Weeks and Dr. John Mildinhall, reveals, "our relationships with other people help make our lives meaningful, and friendships play an important part in this."

Heads Up Psychology explained that people can have several friendships, but they normally have only one significant other. Psychologists have come up with several different theories as to why people desire this special type of relationship. One theory states that people seek a romantic love because of its evolutionary purpose: reproduction and offspring. Another theory explains that people correlate love to attachment. This type of love encompasses the ideas of mutual care and romance. Love can come in many different forms. According to Heads Up Psychology, it can vary "from passionate, romantic love to contented companionship." This can be exemplified by: arranged marriages. polygamy, and same-sex relationships. Heads Up Psychology explains that some psychologists believe physical attraction derives from evolution, and that people choose their partners based on "who will be best suited to produce successful children-we are attracted to people who are healthy, fit, and powerful." According to Sarah Knapton, Science Editor of The Telegraph, "Having a face which is equal on both sides is a biological advert which tells prospective partners that good genes will be found in this body."

The Legend of St. Valentine

Almost 150 million cards will be exchanged around the U.S. on Valentine's Day, and over 50% of these cards will be purchased six days before the holiday. This makes Valentine's Day somewhat of a delight for procrastinators, especially because more than half of the U.S. population celebrates this holiday simply by giving cards to their friends or significant other, according to research done by Hallmark. Roses, of course, also make up almost all of the bouquets given out on Valentine's Day, with 73% of flower purchases near the holiday made by men. The average person spends nearly \$102 on presents, meals, and gifts for Valentine's Day, but why celebrate Valentine's Day in this fashion? Who started the tradition of giving people cards, (and sometimes chocolate, unless it disappears before its dispersal) and why do people sign these cards with phrases like "secret admirer" or "your Valentine"?

Legend says that Valentine's Day originated during the third century in Rome. Emperor Claudius II decided one day that single men made much better soldiers than married men, so he outlawed all marriages for younger men. A young priest named Valentine thought this to be absurd, and he became furious with the injustice, ultimately defying the Emperor's rule and continuing to marry young people in secret. Of course, Valentine's actions became revealed to Claudius, who sentenced Valentine to death. In jail, Valentine soon fell in love with the jailer's daughter, and she would visit him in secret at the prison. Soon before his execution, Valentine wrote a letter to the girl, which he signed, "From Your Valentine", an expression still used to this day. Around 496 AD, Pope Gelasius declared February 14 a day to honor Valentine, who by this time had become considered as a saint, according to history.com.

The selling of flowers first became introduced by King Charles the II of Sweden. Each flower had a different meaning attached to it in a bouquet, and it sent nonverbal messages to the recipient. A quite interesting concept it seems, to imagine people having entire conversations with only flowers. Today, however, flowers mainly just represent love and sentiments of admiration, according to proflowers.com.

According to history.com, Richard Cadbury became the first to create the

romantic in all of us. According to byrdie.com,

Stephanie Cacioppo conducted a study titled "Neuroimaging of Love" which touches base on every chemical reaction and emotional response within the brain that contributes to love at first sight. According to Cacioppo, falling in love requires four stages; chemistry, cognition, preference/ reward, and the desire to be with one another in the long run. Dozens of areas within the brain work together to produce the euphoria one may feel during this time. The chemicals released that make up this feeling include dopamine, oxytocin, adrenaline, and vasopressin.

According to Cacioppo, the two-stage process of falling in love "Based on our findings on love, we make the hypothesis that the concept of falling in love could correspond to the awareness (consciousness) of being in love with someone." Someone not only has to feel love, but know they have fallen in love. Since love requires consciousness, how long can love take? A year? A day? An hour? According to the University of Chicago, it takes a half of a second to fall in love. chocolate box in the 1840's, shortly after he improved his company's chocolate process by learning to extract pure cocoa butter from whole beans. This became a much more palatable taste than any kind of chocolate the British had previously tasted up to that point, and Cadbury saw it as an opportunity to sell more of his product. He began hand-making the chocolate boxes himself, each beautifully designed and special for the future owner.

Although the history behind chocolate boxes and flowers doesn't have much to do with Valentine's Day itself, besides that Americans happily adapted them into the holiday, they both have beautiful backgrounds, however, which go fittingly with the beautiful holiday.



The ability to fall in love with just a glance also relates to a person's age. The younger the person the easier it tends to be to fall in love, says Dr. Salida Afridi, a clinical psychologist at the Human Relations Institute located in Dubai. Dr. Afridi states, "When we are young we don't understand the meaning of true love. We are more likely to think that love at first sight will last. Unfortunately, this is not the case unless we work at it. Otherwise it typically lasts anywhere between three to four months and three to four years."

Love at first sight does not only have to do with reactions within the brain, but connections to the past as well. According to heysigmund.com, "The real secret behind why we fall in love at first sight is because something in the way this particular person happens to look, has triggered a comparison in our subconscious mind to someone from our past who meant a lot to us." For example, while one person might see a girl/guy on the street and declare destiny, another can see that same person and feel no out of this world pull to them. The feeling all boils down to the brain, not the heart.



Unknown Black History Month

In 1975, the month of February officially became designated as Black History Month. Black History Month serves as an annual celebration of achievements and acknowledgement for the roles of African Americans throughout the years. Black History Month originated to educate and inform those unaware of African American influence on history. Examples of impactful African Americans can be referenced below,

Robert Smalls (April 5, 1889- February 23, 1915):

Robert Smalls, born into Slavery, in Beaufort, South Carolina became a ship's pilot according to blackpast.org. During the American Civil War, Smalls became sea captain and a politian. On May 13, 1862, Smalls freed himself and his crew and their families from slavery when he led a Confederate transport ship called the CSS Planter, sailing it north towards freedom. Smalls also helped persuade President Abraham Lincoln to accept African American soldiers in the Union Army.

Berry Gordy Jr. (1929– Present):

According to biography.com, at the age of 29 Gordy established Motown Records. Gordy represented known artist such as Diana Ross, Marvin Gaye, and Stevie Wonder. By 1972, Motown had output more than 100 top 10 songs. Gordy achieved success in movies and TV. In 1988, Motown sold for \$61 million dollars.

Noble Drew Ali (1886-1929)


Noble Drew Ali, born Timothy Drew in North Carolina, founded the Moorish Science Temple of America in Newark, New Jersey. He wanted to promote civic involvement and provide African Americans with a sense of identity in the West. According to PBS.com, Ali preached the importance of unity and pride in the black community.

Claudette Colvin (1939-Present)

At only 15 years old, Claudette Colvin became the first to be arrested for resisting bus segregation in Montgomery, Alabama.

According to Biography.com, Colvin served as one of the four plaintiffs in the legal case Browder vs. Gayle. The case proved Montgomery's segregated bus system unconstitutional. Colvin later became a Civil Rights activist and nurse in Manhattan.

African Americans exist as more than just slavery and Civil Rights. Like the examples given. African Americans have influenced music, art, science, and more. includes the personality or social background of a potential partner. *Heads Up Psychology* says, "Some psychologists think that we are attracted to people with a similar outlook to ourselves, whose needs and resources complement our own, or who have the same social standing."

Robert Sternberg, psychologist and Human Development Professor at Cornell University, believes that love also has a triangle. This includes three factors: passion, intimacy, and commitment. JK Rowling

Still devastated by her mother's death, Rowling moved to Portugal in 1991 to work as an English teacher. There she met and married a Portuguese journalist, and shortly gave birth to her daughter, Jessica, in 1993. However, when their marriage ended in divorce, Rowling moved to Scotland to be closer to her sister, Di, in Scotland, taking her Harry Potter manuscript and daughter with her. Unfortunately, a teaching job in Scotland requires a post graduate certificate of education, which demands a year-long course of study, according to gradesaver.com. So, jobless J.K. Rowling struggled to feed her daughter and herself on welfare, spending nearly every evening working on her book in local cafés with her daughter in a stroller.

Finally, in 1995, Rowling completed her book. The second agent she contacted decided to take on the task of finding her a publisher, and after 12 publishing companies rejected the book, one accepted it on the 13th try. Concussions

Collision sports have the highest rate of concussions. According to the National Center for Biotechnology Information (NCBI), a concussion classifies as a traumatic brain injury (TBI) induced by an impulsive force transmitted to the head resulting from a direct or indirect impact to the head, face, neck, or elsewhere. Every year an estimated 38 million children and adolescents participate in a sport in the United States. Out of those 38 million, 1.7 million of them suffer from a TBI, causing 1.365 million emergency room visits, and 275,000 hospitalizations.

These concussions may cause a wide range of symptoms. Clinical signs and physical signs include, nausea, loss of consciousness, lack of focus, slow reaction times, irritation, and more. Due to these neurologic impairments, people who get a concussion do not recognize they have one.

Also, the coach and athletic trainer sometimes do not receive an indication to check for the injury. This issue causes the coaches and trainers not to follow the proper guidelines when diagnosing a concussion. Since then, Heads Up created a program to educate parents, coaches, athletic trainers, athletes, and school administrators on brain injuries for the youth. This research program has been seen to improve high school coaches' knowledge on the evaluation and signs of a concussion.

Out of all the sports, American football has the highest number of brain injuries in the US. According to the NCBI, "since the 1982–83 season, there have been 133 football players with incomplete neurological recovery from catastrophic head injury. 120 of these injuries occurred in high school athletes, eleven occurred in college participants, two occurred in sandlot players, and none occurred in professional football players. In 2009, all nine cerebral injuries with incomplete recovery were in high school athletes." This shows the change in just a few years of football.



Head injury rates have skyrocketed over the years and only get worse. In 2008, Collegiate athletics reported 245 concussions, resulting in a concussion injury rate of 0.39 per 1000 athletes. What can be done to save these athletes from permanent brain damage? While people enjoy watching football, watchers and players should still acknowledge the risks of the game.
